



India, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Nepal


48 CSOs was mapped:

CS4ME 2022 Statement for World Malaria Day 2022





The Civil Society for Malaria Elimination (CS4ME) call on decision makers and leaders to: Advance equity and prioritise local civil society in the implementation of malaria interventions through the following actions:

- Move from a purely medical approach to malaria control to a multi-sectoral approach with a community focus that takes into account important factors such as the socio-economic, cultural and gender related norms, contexts, and realities of people in communities affected by malaria
- Identify in-country vulnerable populations and develop and involve civil society in specific interventions for these populations (efugues, internally displaced people, orphans, people living in conflict zones, people living in rural areas, pregnant women and children under five etc.
- Implement differentiated programs to address barriers to accessing to quality malaria services and care faced by the most vulnerable populations
- Address gender inequalities in malaria control programs and policies. Recent Evidence suggests that
 women's ability to access malaria prevention and treatment is frequently limited by their low
 socio-economic standing within their households and communities?
- Recognize and work with local community expertise and reach needed to achieve malaria objectives
- Meaningfully involve local civil society organizations in implementation to ensure better community
 engagement and sustainability of malaria control investments
- Ensure fair remuneration for community health workers, many of whom are women who work hard to
 ensure communities have access to health centers
- Commit funds to against malaria, TB and HIV during the Global Fund 7th replenishment to reach the target of \$18 billio
- Increase national health budgets in endemic countries in line with the 15% promise made in the Abuja Declaration 2001 and increase the benefits of local medical staff, hospital and health centers who are front line fighters.

Every minute a child under the age of five dies from malaria.

We have the power to change this
let's act now!



Key messages World Malaria Day 2022

- 1. As a member of the community, we have a responsibility to fight malaria, because we all have a stake in it. Let's #FightForWhatCounts to achieve a malaria-free world. Let's make sure our family members are protected and sleep under bed nets. #MeetTheTarget #EndMalaria
- 2. Today, the impact of malaria is more visible than ever: children are absent from school, a child dies of malaria every minute. Civil society is advocating for the strengthening of health systems to effectively fight this disease and save lives. #EndMalaria #FightForWhatCounts #MeetTheTarget #InvestInCommunities
- 3. Local health staff, community health workers are key actors in the fight against malaria. Dear leaders, it is urgent to increase their benefits by increasing the national budget allocated to health. #MeetTheTarget #FightForWhatCounts
- 4. It is important to mobilize the necessary funds for malaria at the 7th Global Fund Replenishment Conference to reach the \$18 billion target. #MeetTheTarget #FightForWhatCounts








 You dedicate your work to fighting malaria. Why is this fight still important today?

If we go back to 2014, before the Regional Artemisinin-resistance **Initiative** (RAI) grant started in this region, there was no platform nor opportunities for communities to express their concern and share their best practices. I started coordinating the malaria CSO platform 8 years ago with a small group of people, and now we have more than 50 organizations working together as a platform. Our work is to document evidence of best practices and share our findings with other programmes and countries, and advocate on


CS4ME Catalytic funding to support Civil Society in malaria responses



CS4ME Subgrant Mechanism for Civil Society (start date: January 2023)




- <u>Project 1:</u> Raise at least 250 000 \$ to support 4 CSOs for 12 months catalytic projects
 (Example: Increasing advocacy for specific malaria vulnerable groups: prisoners,
 refugies,)
- <u>Project 2:</u> Strengthen CSOs in key areas like Finance Management, Human Resources
 Management, Monitoring and Evalutaion, Development of strong organizational
 systems
- <u>Project 3:</u> Support the engagement and meaningful contribution of malaria Civil
 Society voices in the development of the next Global Fund country malaria concept
 notes in at least 10 countries (Cost of local CSOs experts to support malaria CSOs in
 their countries, Coordination fees, Development of tool, Funding to support
